## Preps

### Positive Behaviour

I would like to start with an acknowledgement of the outstanding behaviour of Prep children at Parade on Monday. Prep students demonstrated they could “be respectful” with their beautiful 5Ls or whole body listening (eyes looking, lips closed, legs crossed, ears listening, hands in laps). I was very proud of our amazing Preps. Great job Preppies and keep it up!

This week in Phonics we are revising initial sounds – the first sound in a word. For example /b/ in bed or /t/ in today. We are also learning to spell words with the blend /st/ in them – stay, star, stop, list, last etc. It is fantastic to see the progress we have made from learning single sounds in term one to beginning to write and spell. Reading and writing our sight words and working on or extending our Magic 100 words remains a priority.

### Guided Reading

We have recently had many visitors to our school to watch how we teach Reading at WoodLinks SS. Well done to our Preps who remained focussed and engaged learners despite the excitement of new faces around the room. It has been wonderful to see the positive behaviour of our children and their hard work in Guided Reading. It really is making a difference to the children’s confidence and their enjoyment of reading, as well as their progress up the reading levels.

### Maths

In Maths this week we are working on a Mathematical Guided Inquiry answering the question – Can you build a house just the right size for a teddy? It is great fun watching the children plan, build, and discuss their creations. Talking about measurement including concepts such as capacity (how much space is in the container and how much it holds) and length (how long and how tall) at home when doing cooking or packing lunch boxes will greatly assist your child as they begin to understand and work with measurement.

### English

In English we have been enjoying exploring letter writing and reading different stories such as “Hunting for Dragons”. This week we are writing a letter to a familiar character and considering their opinion and whether or not we agree with them. Children are making connections to the story and expressing their ideas through writing a letter. You can support your child by allowing them to write shopping lists, invitations or letters/cards at home. It can be pretend play or helping you out with a “real list”! At this stage the spelling is not as important as having a go and listening for the sounds in words and being a “have-a-go” kid with writing.

Finally, a big thank you to parents for supporting the Prep Teachers with donations of small boxes and other supplies for our classrooms. We appreciate your support!

## Year 1's

Term 4 is travelling full steam ahead! It will be a very hot week so please make sure your child always has a hat and a drink bottle.
